

Portraiture

Due date- Fri, Feb 21 (even), Mon, Feb 24 (odd)

For this project, you must take portraits of **6 different people**. Please review the artist information below prior to taking these pictures. 3 of the portraits must be of someone you know well, a family member or a friend. 3 of the portraits must be of someone you've met recently, within the past few days or weeks (a classmate is a perfect choice). The people you choose to photograph must be **fully clothed** and **must agree to be photographed**. You may use Photoshop to alter the image to fit your theme. Place the images in a PowerPoint presentation. Do not include animation, music, etc. **Choose your best portrait and print it on 5x7 photo paper.**

Review the following artists work **prior** to taking pictures. You may find information about them online or by using one of the books in class. Once you find their work, please answer the following questions about EACH photographer. Remember, very few photographers took only one type of photograph. Make sure you are viewing one of their **portraits** before answering the questions. Answer these questions in your journal and in complete sentences.

- 1) What does this photograph tell you about the person being photographed?
- 2) Can you tell what the relationship is between the photographer and the model, or person being photographed?
- 3) What makes their style unique?
- 4) Explain what makes this portrait 'eye-catching'.
